While waiting for the CCES data, we may explore outside funding pending further analyses of the spring 2012 data.

Data collection is currently under way, and is being supported by a grant from the Arete Foundation. The first paper is on "integrity and leadership," and will be completed during the 2012-2013 academic year.
